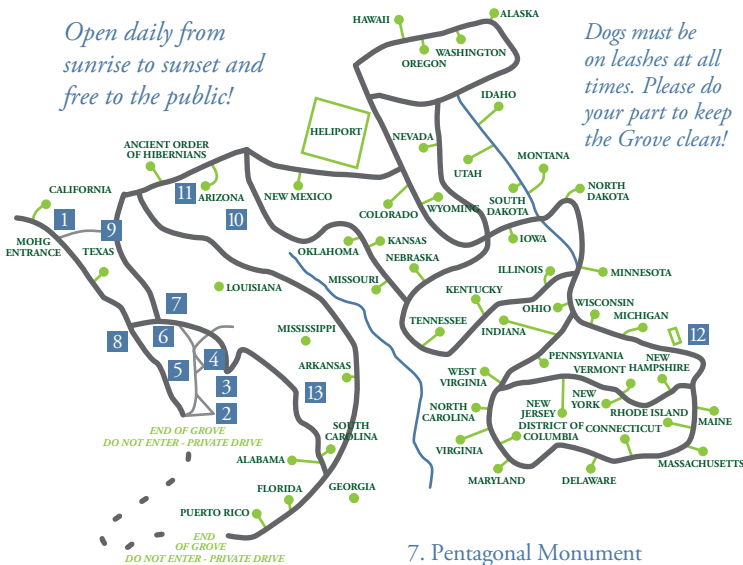


MEDAL OF HONOR GROVE

ABOUT THE GROVE

The Medal of Honor Grove is the oldest living memorial honoring the more than 3,500 Medal of Honor recipients.

Nestled in the wooded hills above the Schuylkill River, on the campus of Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge, the Medal of Honor Grove offers something for everyone. A tribute to those who have received our nation's highest honor, the Grove serves as a beautiful place of remembrance for the brave souls who risked and, in most cases, made the ultimate sacrifice. The Grove is a hidden gem for local families that love the shaded, pedestrian-only pathways that are perfect for folks visiting with small children, strollers, scooters, wheelchairs and dogs on a leash. Benches are conveniently placed next to each monument. Located next to Valley Forge National Historical Park, the Grove is open from sunrise to sunset and free to the public.



The Grove is owned by Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge and maintained by the FRIENDS of the MEDAL of HONOR GROVE. It was placed under a conservation easement agreement in 2017 ensuring its preservation in perpetuity.

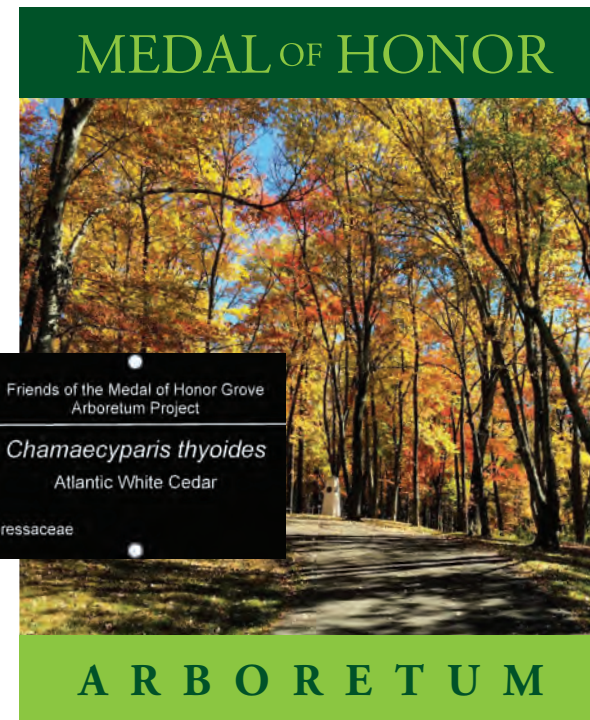
VISITOR HIGHLIGHTS

Within the Grove, there is an area of land for each of the 50 states, as well as Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia. The recipients of each state are identified by name, rank, and service branch on an obelisk. Recipients are additionally honored with a ground marker engraved with their name, branch of service, and the date and location of the act of valor.



The **Chaplains Memorial** honors the nine Chaplains who received the Medal of Honor.

The **Ancient Order of Hibernians Monument** is an obelisk dedicated by the AOH in 1985 for the more than 150 immigrants who received the Medal of Honor but were unable to be accredited to any state because they were not citizens.



NEW! In 2019 the Grove was approved for Level 1 arboretum accreditation through the ArbNet program. Among the more than 50 varieties of trees in the 42-acre park are Cedar of Lebanon, Landsdowne Sycamore, Pawpaw, Eastern Nine Bark, Valley Forge American Elm and Oakleaf "Ruby Slippers" Hydrangea.
